congregations in our towns and villages often competing with one another.

Our self interest has drawn us away from our Christian call and purpose!

We have unintentionally, in some cases, lost sight of the call of Jesus to make disciples. We have become complacent and have been diverted from our main purpose.

So this coming session let us all focus on the command of Jesus to make disciples, not only collectively as a church but as individuals as well.

We have been blessed recently to welcome and introduce 8 new members to our congregation. We extend a warm welcome to them and wish them well as we grow together in faith and love.

Let as many as possible, adults and children, respond on a Sunday morning when we hear the invitation, **Let us worship God!**








We resume after our summer break on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> August from 9.45 – 11.45am.

We are most grateful for all the support we receive week by week. Many thanks for all donations of baking, tea, coffee, sugar and money that we receive on a regular basis. We are very fortunate for our regular assistants and also the ladies and gentlemen who come when required, sometimes at the drop of a hat, when a regular assistant is not available. We also appreciate all our faithful customers, without you there would be no Coffee Bean. If you haven't managed along yet, please call in some Thursday. We thank Andy and Caroline Gillies for setting up the hall on a Wednesday night.

I am pleased to inform you that we have been able to gift to the church £8000 to help with the repairs to the manse. The new cooker has now been installed and is looking great. We received a grant of £1000 from the Wind Farm Fund and the Coffee Bean paid the balance of £1300. We also applied for a grant from the Development Trust Fund to purchase a new floor cleaner. We were awarded £2100. Total cost for this machine was £2217. Coffee Bean made up the shortfall. We have been very successful in our grant applications and thankful for the funds we have been able to accumulate ourselves. The Coffee Bean keeps going from strength to strength. If you would like to join our 4 weekly baking rota then please speak to me.

I do hope that you have had a nice relaxing holiday, and we look forward to seeing you all again on a Thursday morning.
