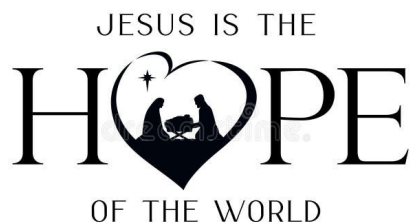
As I write this Scotland has just held an election. Over the last few weeks I have received countless pieces of mail about various candidates and political parties. A key strategy of many politicians is to build on the idea of hope, indicating that if they are elected, they will bring about positive changes that will improve our lives. There is nothing wrong with this, but with all due respect to them and their best intentions to improve things, real and enduring hope that will never disappoint is not found in people, it is only found in God.

Recently I preached on 1 Peter 1:3 which says that God in His great mercy has given us new birth into a “living hope” through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. That idea really struck me, we have a living hope, not a dead one, because we have a risen Saviour. Our hope is found in the one who conquered death. In Romans 5:5 it speaks about the hope we have in Jesus never putting us to shame, it will never disappoint us. Our world is longing for hope, the assurance that everything is going to be okay, thanks to God we can have that hope, that confident expectation that God has all things in control, and nothing can separate us from His love.

My father’s favourite hymn, especially when he was slowly dying of cancer, was *“It is well with my soul”*. It was written by Horatio Gates Spafford right after he suffered the tragic loss of his children. The hymn begins, *“When peace like a river attendeth my way, when sorrows like sea-billows roll; whatever my lot, you have taught me to say, it is well, it is well with my soul.”* We can know that peace that passes understanding, we can know that hope that does not disappoint, that living hope that comes from God. May we be able to say, whatever comes our way, that it is indeed well with our soul, for our hope is in Him.

Last year's donations brought in £19742.95 so far. Thank you to all donators and to Gift Aid conveners for their hard work. Let's try and double that next year.

Thanks to everyone who fundraise in any way, I very much appreciate the work that goes into these events. Let's also remember that the first three letters of fundraise read FUN so while we are working hard to raise money let's all have FUN in doing so.

Demographics.

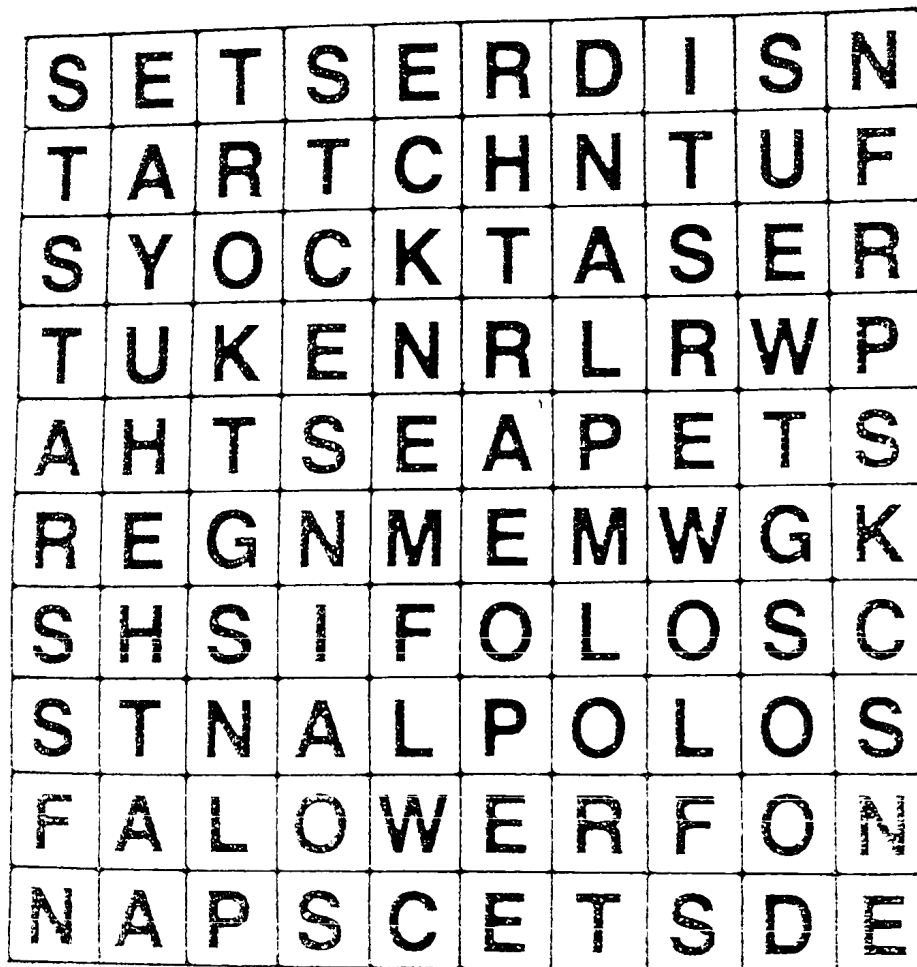
Photographs of the area, amenities, education, culture, transport links etc.. All information agreeable to attracting applications.

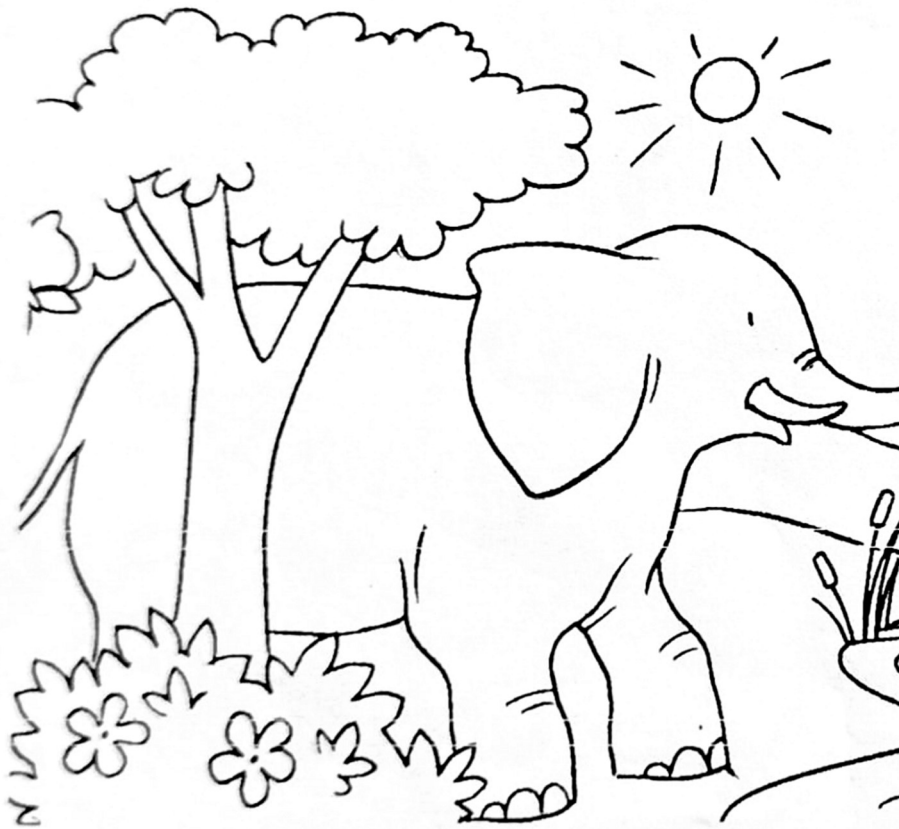

Cumnock Church

Cumnock Church meets at 10:30am each Sunday. As we are now a union of five churches worshipping in four places, the Kirk Session of South East Ayrshire Parish agreed that there should be consistency across the four places of worship. To this end it was agreed there would be four communion services annually : March, June, September and December. Communion Cards previously used as an invitation to attend the service would no longer be used. The Sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated on Sunday 14 June 2026 at 10.30am. This intimation is your **Invitation** to attend. Communion Cards will no longer be issued by elders. At present the Rev. Scott Daily is not allowed by the Church of Scotland to take communion services therefore for the communion service on 14th June the Revs. Yorke and Daily will interchange with the Rev. Yorke preaching in Cumnock and Muirkirk to allow these two churches to have a communion service.

We have had contact from Ross Matthew a solicitor in the law department of the Church of Scotland. He has advised he has made contact with the Church of Scotland estate agency team who will now oversee the process and we await further contact.

Parish Profile.

A small group from all the churches in the union has been set up to build a profile of the Parish as we look to advertising our vacancies for two ministers. A vacancy / nominating committee will also need to be formed and therefore we are

asking for anyone who would be interested in taking part in this group to express your interest. For anyone connected with the Cumnock Church please speak to Ian Ronald.

The **Cumnock Guild** had their closing lunch in the Royal Hotel Cumnock on 14th April 2026 where they enjoyed a lovely meal, friendship and fellowship. They also have planned a highly anticipated guild and guests trip to the Trossachs and Callander on Wednesday 13th May 2026. There will be stops in Aberfoyle, Callander and finishing with High Tea in Castle Carey. The Guild meet on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month from October to March..

It has been agreed for the next guild session commencing in October 2026 that the guilds of Lugar and Cumnock will amalgamate under the convenorship of Mrs Betty Entwistle. Meetings are scheduled to take place in the Cumnock Church Hall, further details will be available in the next church magazine.

are held in the Bute Hall Cumnock Church with the next meeting scheduled for Thursday 4th June 2026 at 4:00pm.

Soup and Sweet Lunch

These are scheduled to take place in the church hall, Barrhill Road, Cumnock on the third Wednesday of the month. There are two scheduled prior to the summer break and these will be held on 20th May and 17th June 2026 at 12 noon. Cost is £4.00 payable at the door with a variety of soups and sweets available finishing off with tea/coffee and biscuits.

Dr. Graham's Homes Kalimpong

On 9th April 2026 a payment of £882.78 was sent to Dr. Graham's Homes where we continue to support a child with living costs and education. This sum was made up of £500 raised at the retiral offering following the funeral of David Purdie a longstanding member and elder of the Cumnock Church. Retiral offerings at the Holy Week Services in Cumnock raised £282.78. Donations totalling £100 were received during February and March giving us the grand total of £882.78.
